WHAT IS DUAL CREDIT?

Postsecondary Enrollment Options (PSEO) is a program that allows 11th and 12th-grade students to earn both high school and college credit while still in high school.

- Most PSEO courses are offered on the campus of the postsecondary institution; some courses are offered online.
- Each participating college or university sets its own admissions requirements for enrollment into the PSEO courses.
- As you plan your 11th grade schedule, 11th grade students may take PSEO courses on a full- or part-time basis.
- For more information, talk to your counselor!
- Students must inform the district by May 30 of each year of their intent to enroll in postsecondary courses during the following school year.

PRE-ACT

- Use your Pre-ACT scores to look into possible career areas!

- Now is a great time to start researching possible post-graduation plans.

WHAT IS REQUIRED TO GRADUATE?

- Twenty-three credits are required in grades 9–12
- Semester courses are worth **0.5** credit
- Year-long courses are worth **1.0** credit

Breakdown of credits

There are **16 required credits**:

- **English** (4 credits)
- **Social Studies** (3.5 credits)
- **Math** (3 credits)
- **Science** (3 credits)
- **Phy. Ed** (1 credit)
- **Health** (.5 credit)
- **Arts** (1 credit)

There are also **7 elective credits** chosen by the student that are required toward the 23 total credits.
